

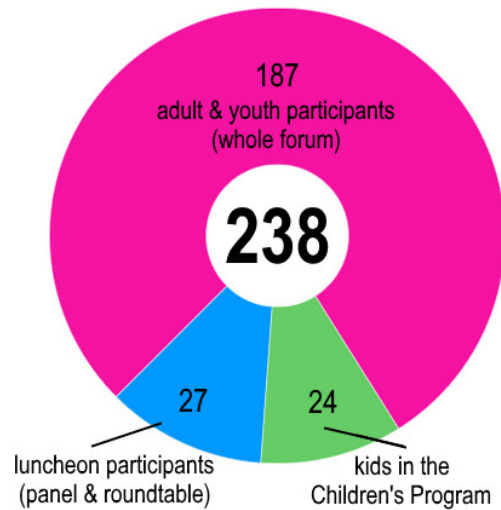

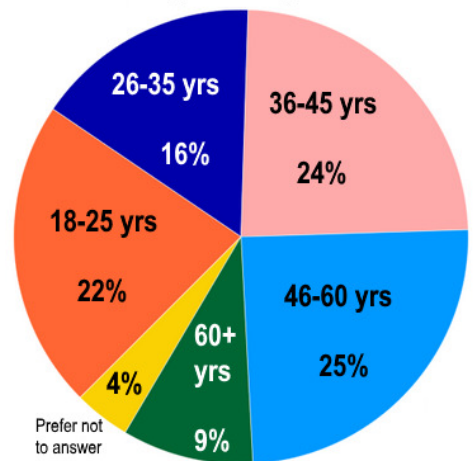

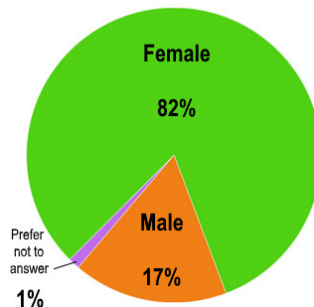
Participants



Age Range

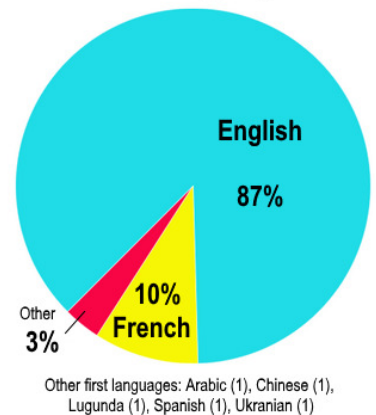


Gender

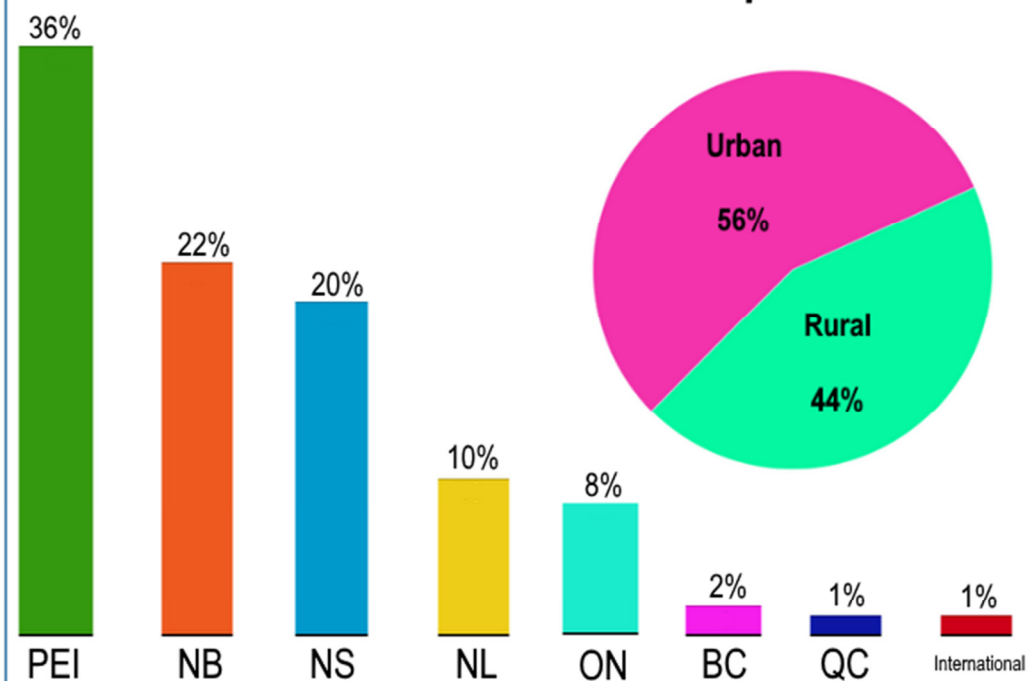

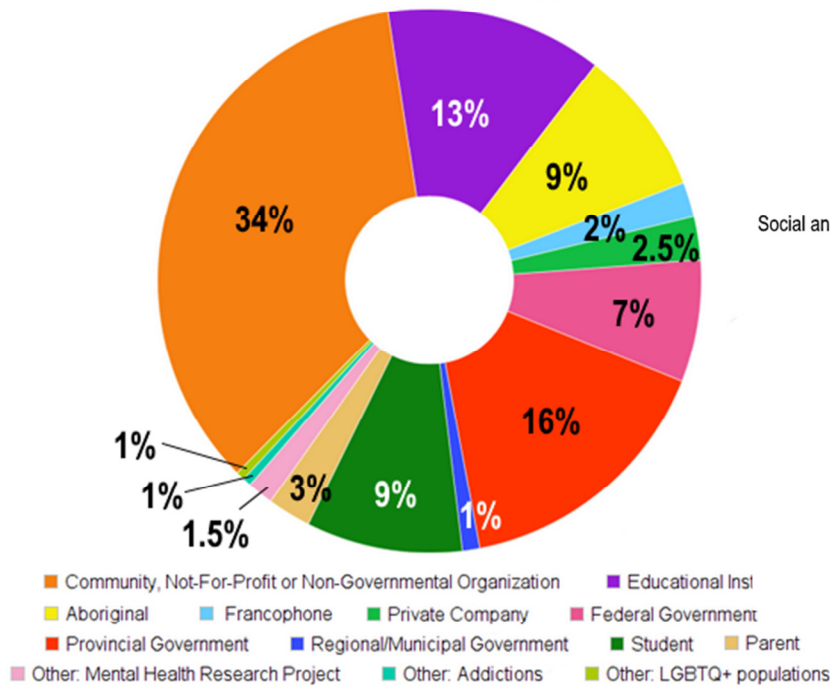


Place of Residence of Participants

The 2018 Forum was the fourth in a series that focused on collective impact for child and youth mental health promotion in Atlantic Canada.

Evaluation Results Showed...

- 100%** of respondents agreed (88%) or somewhat agreed (12%) that the Forum expanded collective understanding of mental health promotion.
- 100%** of respondents agreed (77%) or somewhat agreed (23%) that the Forum was successful in advancing momentum for a whole society approach to mental health promotion.
- 98%** of respondents agreed (72%) or somewhat agreed (26%) that they developed networks for future collaboration.
- 89%** of respondents agreed (77%) or somewhat agreed (12%) that they developed new knowledge and skills that can be applied to their work in their organization and community.
- 100%** of respondents agreed (88%) or somewhat agreed (12%) that they would recommend ASI events to others.
